What to do after a NATURAL DISASTER



Take stock of the damage
Assuming everyone is safe, try to take stock of the damage as soon as possible. List all of the damage in writing. Take photos and/or videos of damage.
Secure your property Take steps to prevent further damage and protect your property from the elements. Secure property against the elements. Check windows, doors, walls, and the roof. Ensure utilities are turned off until a professional can confirm they're safe to use.
Contact your providers
Start the paperwork to document that you've experienced a natural disaster. Landlord and/or mortgage provider, as well as any property manager(s) Your insurance provider(s).
Apply for assistance
To qualify for FEMA assistance, you must be in a presidentially-declared disaster area. If that isn't the case, you may still be eligible for state or local aid. If you aren't sure whether you need assistance and/or if you qualify, it's a good idea to contact FEMA regardless as the documentation may be useful later on.
Secure your records
It's important to keep track of everything, from the initial damage to the cost of repairs and everything in between. Since physical document storage can be difficult under these circumstances, consider digital storage options.
